

### New England Unit TEACHING HERB GARDEN VIOLETS PLANT LIST 2008

Common Name	Botanical Name	Zone	Bloom Time	Comments
Freckles	<i>Viola sororia 'Freckles'</i>	4	May	Spotted blue flowers; stem-less violet, can become invasive and revert to blue violet.
Irish Elegance	<i>Viola sulphurea 'Irish Elegance'</i>	5	April	Yellow-apricot flowers; slight fragrance; part sun.
Korean Violet	<i>Viola koreana 'Sylettas'</i>	4	May	Pink flowers. Variegated foliage. Shade.
Labrador	<i>Viola labradorica</i>	3	May	Purple flowers; purple tinged foliage. Freely self-sowing. Shade.
Pink Sweet Violet	<i>Viola odorata rosea</i>	3	April & Nov.	Pink flowers; very fragrant; rounded leaves and runners; needs some sun to bloom.
Strawberry Violet	<i>Viola odorata 'Rosina'</i>	4	April-May	Pink, fragrant flowers. Prefers partial shade.
Sweet Violet	<i>Viola odorata 'Queen Charlotte'</i>	5	May	Blue flowers; fragrant; rounded leaves and runners. Needs some sun to bloom.
Sweet Violet	<i>Viola odorata 'Lianne'</i>	4	April	Bluish-purple flowers, fragrant; rounded leaves and runners, needs some sun to bloom.
Three-Lobed Violet	<i>Viola triloba</i>	4	April-May	Purple flowers with some white at base; leaves can have up to 5-7 lobes; native to area.
