Bella Donna	<i>Rosa 'Bella Donna'</i>	damask	3 thru 8	6ft	pink, double, fragrant; blooms once	Bred before 1848.
Blanc Double de Coubert	<i>Rosa rugosa 'Blanc Double de Coubert'</i>	hybrid rugosa	3 thru 8	6ft	white, semi-double, fragrant; repeats bloom	Bred in France in 1892. Hybrid rugosa and Sombreuil. Very disease resistant
Eglanteria	<i>Rosa 'Eglanteria'</i>	species	2 thru 8	8-10 ft..	small, single pink flowers; fragrant; blooms once	Decorative hips. Leaves have apple scent. Shade tolerant. Bred before 1551 . Very disease resistant.
Fantin Latour	<i>Rosa 'Fantin-Latour'</i>	centifolia	4 thru 9	3 - 6 ft	light pink, darker center; medium to large double; fragrant; blooms once	Bred before 1900. susceptible to mildew. Blooms on old wood. Prune after flowering is finished.
Frau Dagmar Hartopp	<i>Rosa rugosa 'Frau Dagmar Hartopp'</i>	hybrid rugosa	3 to 9	3 - 4 ft	Pink, single, strong fragrance. Occasional repeat bloomer.	Bred in Denmark around 1911. Large scarlet hips. Disease resistant. <b>Located in Edible Plant bed.</b>
Hansa	<i>Rosa rugosa 'Hansa'</i>	hybrid rugosa	3 thru 8	5 - 7ft	red-purple, double flowers; very fragrant, repeat bloomer	Bred in Netherlands in 1905. Disease resistant; rose hips form in fall.
Kazanlik	<i>Rosa damascena trigintipetula</i>	Origin unknown	4 thru 9	5 - 7 ft	soft pink, semi-double, very fragrant, blooms once	Ancient origin. Used for attar of roses. Blooms on old wood. Prune after flowering is finished.

New Dawn	<i>Rosa 'New Dawn'</i>	climbing rose	5 to 9	7 - 10ft	light pink, semi-double, repeat bloomer; fragrant;	Bred in US in 1930. Disease resistant; shade tolerant; blooms on old wood. Prune after bloom.
Roseaie de l'Hay	<i>Rosa rugosa 'Roseaie de l'Hay'</i>	hybrid rugosa	5 thru 8	6 - 12 ft.	large, red, double; fragrant; occasional repeat bloomer	Bred in France in 1901. Sets few hips. Disease resistant.
Rubrifolia	<i>Rosa glauca rubrifolia</i>	species	2 thru 9	6 ft x 6ft	small, single pink flowers; fragrant; blooms once	Decorative hips, burgundy foliage, shade tolerant, disease resistant
Sombreuil	<i>Rosa 'Sombreuil'</i>	climbing tea	5 thru 8	8 plus ft.	large white, full double, fragrant; occasional repeat bloomer.	Shade tolerant; bred before 1850. <b>Located on east and west arbors</b>
Therese Bugnet	<i>Rosa rugosa 'Therese Bugnet'</i>	hybrid rugosa	4 thru 8	6ft x 6ft	medium pink, light fragrance; occasionally repeats bloom	Bred in Canada by George Bugnet in 1950. Shade tolerant. Disease resistant
William Baffin	<i>Rosa 'William Baffin'</i>	climbing rose	4 thru 9	7- 10 ft.	deep pink, semi-double, fragrant, occasional repeat bloomer	Hybrid kordesii; Canadian developed Explorer Series; disease resistant. <b>Located on east and west arbors.</b>
